

Results Summary of Recent Facilities Survey

In July, the district commissioned a third-party random sampled survey of resident satisfaction on a number of issues. Conducting a professional survey provides a key snapshot at how respondents feel throughout the community.

Over the course of the last 15 months, our schools have spent a significant amount of time engaging our community in dialogue regarding the needs of our aging school buildings. This is an important conversation as it ultimately affects our ability to offer a quality education and to control fiscal costs.

As your superintendent, I am very thankful to the community for engaging in our conversations. Those conversations, in addition to this data, helps provide critical data points to aide in our future discussions and direction.

Within the survey results, I wish to point out a few key findings from the survey:

- A majority of members of our community believe that the Athens City School District provides a quality educational experience for our students.
- Many people in our community are not aware of the current state of our facilities and the need to make costly improvements to our buildings. More than half believe most of our buildings are in fair condition or better, or have no opinion.
- A majority of members of our community believe the Board should make decisions to operate the district as efficiently as possible while still providing a quality education.
- There is significant resistance to the current plans being considered by the Board in relation to the elementary school portion of the Facilities Master Plan. Specifically, there are concerns with the single campus concept.

I don't like the way they teach and focus too much on sports, rather than the main subject.

What I have been reading is that they want to get rid of everything and make a mega school; neighborhood schools are very important.

I don't have children in elementary, but I have heard that they want to build one school where all the kids will be sent in buses, and I feel like that's not good all kids should be able to walk home back from school.

They focus too much on sports and less on academics.

They want to make a mega school and I don't think that is a good ideal.

The stupid way they want to change the schools and build new schools and get rid of the neighborhood schools.
